Race Fleet News

Man Overboard Drill

This is an all call to TTPYC boaters. We have two serious topics to cover. First we need to discuss MOB throw line techniques and secondly we need help with our signature racing event of the year, Duwamish Head.

When it comes to MOB situations, we mostly hope and pray that it won't be "us" that everyone is reading about in the next issue of our favorite boating magazine. Most of us carry the required floating devices designed to be thrown in such an event, and the majority of those also carry retrieval gear for getting victims back on board. One of the most basic retrieval tools in boating is a throw bag. A line that is stuffed into a floating bag that is designed to be thrown towards a MOB victim to aid in bringing them back on board. The principle is that when you throw the bag, the line should payout from the bag and the bag should land in the vicinity of the victim. The reality is that the majority of boaters never practice throwing this apparatus, which means that when it counts, it is next to useless, if not an actual hazard. However, with a modest amount of periodic practice the majority of boaters can become quite proficient with a throw bag and they can actually retrieve MOB's faster with better outcomes than with other retrieval methods. This means less time in the water and a greater chance of bold if not embarrassed story telling by those rescued.

There will be a hands on session to practice with throw bags at the club's storage locker at Des Moines Marina on December 15, 2018. If you have your own throw bag, bring it along. If you don't yet have one, come and find out what it is and how it is used and how it should be mounted on your boat. Hope to see you there.

Duwamish Head Race

The second topic that needs attention from the boaters in our club is pulling off our signature racing event for the year. Our Duwamish Head Race is being held on January 5, 2018. We need volunteers to help with parking visiting boats on the Friday afternoon and evening before the race. We don't expect people to stay for the entire day, but whatever time you could offer would be very helpful and also a great way to show other crews what a great club we are. Visiting boats begin arriving about 1:00 in the afternoon and continue until about 8:00 Friday night. The majority arrive in the late afternoon and early evening. Many will need to raft, which is where the real help needs to come in. We need hands willing to guide guests to open slips and helping them tie off. Once our guests have been secured, we need

members to help welcome them with a warm beverage and something to eat. Bluntly, we need people to offer some soups, chowders, and snacks in the party tent on the dock. The party tent is heated by the way. We also need help with the breakfast on Saturday morning.

We also need help with the starting sequence for the race. We need people to help with the starting and finishing sequences. Volunteers will be helping with the flag sequence that sets each class off for its day of racing. We will also need several people to help with the recording of finishing times and identifying sail numbers at the conclusion of the race. Fortunately, there is a considerable window of time between the starting and finishing activities so people do not have to commit to the entire day. Volunteers could commit for either the starts or the finish, and if they choose both. Classes for starting a race and for taking finish times will be held on December 15, 2018 at 1:00 at the club's storage locker immediately following our MOB throw devices class.

Winter Vashon

This year's addition of the Winter Vashon Race had a strong resemblance to last year's. This means that there was very little breeze to be had. Boat's struggled to make it to the north end of Vashon Island for the shortened course finish. The first couple of miles showed most boats taking similar courses a progress while slow was fairly steady. Once boats passed the first day mark in Colvos Passage, strategies and wind conditions changed. A split in the wind developed between the west and east sides of the passage. Boats that managed to get to the west made out much better than fools like me on the east that couldn't get past the center of the passage before conditions forced us east again. Several of our TTPYC sailors managed to navigate the lanes of wind successfully and did quite well.

Chuck Hendriks and his crew on Blue Max took 2nd in the Commodore FS class. TTPYC owned class 8 by taking a 1,2,&3 sweep. Mark Harang and crew took 1st, Pat Stewart and crew took 2nd, and Tom Davis and crew finished it out with 3rd. Very impressive sailing by very good sailors

The next race in this series is our club's signature racing event, Duwamish Head, on Jan. 5, 2019. It would be great to see you all there to wish the fleet well.
