SPLICING - A HANDS ON EXPERIENCE

Will you be one to occupy space around a table to learn about splicing from an EXPERT? Mark your calendar now to come to the last social of Dennis's year as Commodore.

This program will engage you for an hour.

Most people that know me feel that I am an experienced competent sailor and a reasonable racer. I started sailing Sunfish sailboats when I was eight years old at the beach by my aunt's cottage. The hook was set and I haven't been far from the water since. I have been involved with racing, boat building, sail making, and rigging since my early teens. I worked for North Sails for three years in the early eighties and delivered boats up and down the East Coast to and from racing venues. Then I got a real job. Presently, my entire racing sail inventory consists of sails that I have built myself and I have done all of my own standing rigging for the last forty two years.

Rope Splices You Can Do

This presentation will take 30 minutes to demonstrate and another 30 for attendees to try their hand at one of the two splices being presented. The only presentation aids needed to conduct this is a small table, preferably centrally located in the group or crowd. This is a demonstration and hands on practice of two different types of rope splices that you can do without any major research or practice. We will be exploring a traditional three strand rope eye splice and a newer 12 strand single braid eye splice. The tools needed to perform these splices are minimal and easily found or fabricated. You will discover that splicing is more about patience and understanding the materials than about skill or experience. We will demonstrate both splices and attendees will have the opportunity to try one of the two splices. The entire presentation is conducted in the space of one hour or less. Taking notes or photos is encouraged to help you on your own boats.
