Getting Into Birdwatching Around Local Marinas



On April 13 th at our monthly zoom meeting you will have the chance to learn interesting and amazing things birds can do. In preparation for this event, I asked Sandy two questions.

Why did you get into birding?

I have been interested in birds since childhood. Honestly, I can't exactly say why...they just fascinate me. I decided to major in Wildlife Biology as an undergraduate at WSU and then I was "all in". I went on to earn a Master's degree at Texas A&M, Kingsville, and a PhD. at University of Nevada, Las Vegas. Both graduate research projects dealt with investigations of bird populations. My focus for my doctoral research was the effects of invasive plant species on bird populations in desert riparian areas. I taught wildlife biology classes for 21 years at Clark College in Vancouver and am now retired. Retirement has given me time to help with local wildlife habitat rehab projects and time to do more birding both locally and abroad.

Why should the club care?

Bird populations face challenges and are decreasing worldwide mostly due to human causes. Birds are also frequently "biological indicators" of healthy or unhealthy ecosystems. They are valuable in their own right, as well as being indicators of how well the ecosystems function for humans. As boaters, we share space with many species that call Puget Sound home and we directly impact that ecosystem. We need to be good

stewards of our waterways for all wildlife for their benefit and for the benefit of future generations of people. Being aware of what species are out there is a start to understanding how "good stewardship" happens.

Set your alarm for 6:30 pm. Sandy will begin her presentation at 6:45. Hope you will join us. You then will become a more engaged and active observer of birds who share our planet.

Racing News Dean Contí, Race Fleet Captaín Duane Rubash, Assistant Race Fleet Captain

I would like to start out with a BIG heart felt thank you to

all the many members that have heeded my calls for help in the race mark replacement project. Not sure if you all know but in the span of less than one year all the TTPYC permanent race marks failed. They were all rescued and were placed in the storage lot at the marina. We are installing all new, heavier duty ground tackle and refurbishing the floats with new parts and graphics. Three marks, C, J and L, are finished and back in the water. Our goal is to have at least two more back in the water by the first weekend of April.

In conjunction with the mark replacement and the easing of Covid-19 restrictions we are resurrecting our club Spring race series that run Thursday evenings through April and May. They are listed on the TTPYC web site and are available on Regatta Networks for registration. All start times are 6:30PM.

Late Spring: May 6, 13, 20 & 27

There will be at least two classes, one for PHRF racers and one for cruisers. If you don't have a rating, don't worry, we will assign you one for the series. If you need crew or want to crew let me know. So this is the official call for all of you to get your sailboats out there so we can save our club racing program!

We need a committee boat and typically the race boats take turns running the race. If a power boat would volunteer for the job, that would free up one of the racers. We can supply training and support if you haven't run a race before. Heck all you power boats should come join us. Just get out on the water!

The final race of the South Sound Series, the Islands Race, was successfully run by the Gig Harbor Yacht Club. The coarse starts near the entrance to Gig Harbor, goes up Colvos Passage, around a mark a short distance north of Blake Island and back. A wacky day that exactly followed the National Weather Service forecast for lots of wind in the morning, shutting down at noon to nothing, and then filling back in big time at 5PM. The wind didn't actually fill in until 5:15. Overall a fun day on the water with no rain.

All of the Vendee Globe solo, non-stop, around the world racers finished and are safely back in port. A few had to stop for repairs which disqualifies them from the race but they went back out and finished their circumnavigation. Truly an incredible, epic journey. More people have flown in space than have solo, non-stop sailed around the globe. It's really hard.

So the 36th Americas Cup finished with New Zealand retaining The Cup by beating the Italian entry seven races to three. The series was tied up three races apiece but then New Zealand reeled off four straight wins to seal the deal.

We followed the racing closely and decided we are not a big fan of the new boats. While they are trick and go quite fast, a lot of the racing was not very compelling. A majority of the races were won by the boat that won the start with no passing for lead changes. In the ten finals races there were only a small handful of passes.
