The Port of Brownsville Marina has all the amenities of a large marina but with the charm, peacefulness and rustic setting of a small rural community. The first Brownsville dock was built in 1901 by community donated work and continued to be kept up by community effort until the Brownsville Port District was formed 7 April 1920 by special election. Brownsville Port District is what is known as an Independent "Special District." State law defines a special district as "any agency of the state for the local performance of governmental or proprietary functions within limited boundaries." A special district is a separate local government that delivers public services.

Brownsville is located on the Port Orchard Bay half way between Bremerton and Poulsbo making it a convenient place to visit or stay. The Port facility offers both guest and permanent moorage, excellent parking, fuel, large boat ramps, electrical and water hook-ups at all moorage sites. https://portofbrownsville.org September 15<sup>th</sup> is our annual meeting where we nominate the slate of officers for the upcoming year. This meeting is at Angelo's, the first since the pandemic. (Note this is on a Wednesday not our

traditional Tuesday). Also I believe that night there will be a presentation by the Sissons and Valpeys on their rafting trip through the Grand Canyon.

Endeavor, Mapril June, Joyce Marie, Slow


Tango and Pendragon.

## Electronic Flare and Vessel Inspections Info From Alan Riley

Whilst enjoying some idle chatter on the dock at Kingston last weekend I met a US Coast Guard Auxiliary fellow who offered a vessel inspection which I accepted.

Whilst I passed the inspection except for a garbage disposal sticker which I did not have, ( and he gave me one), he noted my flares were due to expire later this year.

He told me that the electronic flares have come down in price considerably and one unit meets the USCG requirements for emergency flares. You still need a flag for daytime use.

I just checked the West Marine website and they have the ACR electronic flare on sale for \$69.99 which for a unit which does not expire like the pyrotechnic flares looks like a good deal. The electronic flare uses regular dry cell batteries which can be replaced.

He also advised that you now need a whistle attached to each life jacket and he gave me some for mine.

Might be worth adding a note in the Barnacle about the flares and the whistles

## Recreational Boaters of Washington

Hello RBAW Affiliated Yacht Clubs,

Great news for boaters!! The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission will

start the repair of ~60 mooring buoys in Western Washington today, July 12. They'll be working to ensure the state-owned buoys are in tip-top shape at Stuart Island, Spencer Spit, Matia Island and (RBAW's favorite) Sucia Island Marine Parks. If a buoy can't be repaired, it will be included in a future effort to replace inoperable buoys.

Please check their <u>website</u> frequently for the mooring buoy repair schedule, updates and future work to improve mooring opportunities. Boaters should be cautious of repair divers in the area and allow extra space around the buoys under repair.

We at RBAW are also very excited to work with State Parks on a project to scope out a more extensive effort to improve moorage opportunities to accommodate the need for additional tie-up capacity for boats. More to come on this!
